Madera Community College Advantage Program (MCCAP)

MCCAP students take 2 pre-identified transferable courses per semester at the Madera Community College (transportation provided for AM). Student who successfully complete all 4 courses have the opportunity to earn 14 general education (GE) college credits and 40 high school elective credits. Classes are held everyday periods 1-2 or periods 5-6. Courses include, but are not limited to: English, Statistics, Psychology, Sociology, Political Science, Criminology, Speech, Business, and Counseling

Eligibility

- Approval from parents, principal, and HS counselor.
- Must be enrolled in at least 4 classes at MSHS
- Enrollment Fees are WAIVED

Madera Community College Enrichment Program

The Madera Community College High School Enrichment Program offers students in 10th, 11th, and 12th grades an opportunity to enroll in college courses and receive college credit for up to two courses per semester. Transportation is not provided and only certain courses receive high school credit for classes.

Merced College Articulation

Agriculture students enrolled in Ag Fabrication, Diesel Engines, and Horticulture have the opportunity to apply to Merced City College and take a practical test to gain college credits for their courses.

Advanced Placement (AP) Program

AP classes offer a challenging and stimulating educational experience for college-bound students and often take more time, require more work, and give greater opportunity for individual growth and accomplishment. In May, AP exams are taken and scored on a 5 point scale. Most major colleges and universities recognize scores of 3, 4, or 5 for college credit. The amount of credit varies by institution. Maddera South High School currently offers 13 AP classes: AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP English Language, AP English Literature, AP Studio Art, AP Calculus AB, AP Calculus, AP European History, AP US History, AP Psychology, AP Spanish Language, AP Spanish Literature,

Dual Enrollment Madera Center

CTE Education Careers - In Spring, students will enroll in Education 10 - Introduction to Teaching. Students will earn 3 college credits and 10 high school elective credits.

CTE Careers with Children - In Spring, students will enroll in Child Development 1 - Principles and Practices of Teaching Young Children. Students earn 3 college credits and 10 high school elective credits.

ERWC/English 1A - 12th grade students take ERWC in the Fall and English 1A, Reading and Composition in the Spring. Students may earn 4 college credits for Engl 1A and 10 high school English credits.

Peer Tutoring - In Fall, students take LA-1, Peer Tutoring. Students receive 1 college unit and 5 high school credits. Spring semester, students take regular high school peer tutoring.

History 11 and 12- 11th grade students will take History 11, **History** of the United States to 1877 in Fall and History 12, History of the United States since 1865 in Spring. Students earn 3 college credits per course and 10 high school history credits per course.

Ag Leadership- In Spring, students will enroll in Computer Applications in Agriculture. Students earn 3 college credits and 10 high school elective credits.

Ag Economics -In Spring, 12th graders will take Agricultural Economics. Students earn 3 college credits and 10 high school elective credits.

CTE Criminology- In the Spring, students will enroll in Criminology 1- Introduction to Criminology. Students will earn 3 college credits and 10 high school elective credits.

Marketing- In Spring, students will enroll in Marketing 10, Marketing. Students will earn 3 college credits and 10 high school elective credits.

- CTE Education Careers is only open to 12th grade pathway completers.
- CTE Careers with Children is open to 11th and 12th grades pathway completers.
- ERWC/English 1A is only open to 12th grade students who qualify
- Peer Tutoring is only offered to 12th grade students.
- History 12 is offered to 11th grade students who qualify.
- Ag Business is offered to our FFA leadership team.
- Ag Economics is offered to Agriculture students who elect to a dual enrollment course
- CTE Criminology is open to 12th grade pathway completers.
- Marketing offered to Business pathway students
