

Safety Protocol

The district's Health & Weliness staff has collaborated with the county's Public Health Department to address guidelines issued by the state's Department of Public Health and Division of Occupational Safety and Health. Following the state and the American Academy of Pediatrics, the following measures will be in place. The following measures will be taking place:

INDOOR MASKS - All students are required to wear a face mask indoors, and so are adults in school settings when sharing indoor spaces with students. MUSD will provide masks to students or staff who accidentally fail to bring one.

SICK AT HOME - Students with COVID-19 symptoms may not return to in-person instruction until 24 hours have passed after a fever has ended without relying on medication, others symptoms have improved, and they've either tested negative, received an alternative diagnosis or explanation of their symptoms from a medical professional, or 10 days have passed since the symptoms began.
