CAASPP - Coming Up Soon! Week of April 25 - May 29 th

Every year, California students take several statewide tests. When combined with other measures such as grades, classwork, and teacher observations, these tests give families and teachers a more complete picture of their child's learning. You can use the results to identify where your child is doing well and where they might need more support.

Your child may be taking one or more of the following California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP), English Language Proficiency Assessments for California (ELPAC), and Physical Fitness Test assessments.

CAASPP: Smarter Balanced Assessments for English Language Arts/Literacy (ELA) and Math

- Who takes these tests? Students in grades 3–8 and grade 11.
- What is the test format? The Smarter Balanced assessments are computer-based.
- Which standards are tested? The California Common Core State Standards.

CSA NEW (California Spanish Assessment

The California Spanish Assessment will be administered at James Madison Elementary School for 3rd and 4th grade students. This new computer-based assessment for students in grades three and four is proposed to measure Spanish skills in reading, writing, and listening. It is part of the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) System of assessments.

The assessment will be developed with a focus on reading, writing, and listening. The target population for the assessment will be: a. students receiving instruction in Spanish in California; and/or students seeking a measure that recognizes their Spanish-specific reading, writing, and listening skills. The assessment will be an online, linear test (i.e., not adaptive).


