Mrs. Gassett went through what the goals are for the new year and what COVID funding is going towards instructional supplies and also able to bring noon aids into the office to help field covid related calls.

- d. What is happening at Desmond to promote college
  - a. Curtis Sweet Presentation

Mr. Sweet introduced himself and Mrs. Gassett made him a co-host in the zoom meeting so that he could share his presentation.

He went over how our school represents colleges on Wednesday.

He showed the program College Next and demonstrated how the students use the site.

Mr. Sweet said that every 7th and 8th grader will use the program.

A-G Presentations about what classes are needed to graduate high school.

CJSF club on campus based on service for the community and campus. Only high achieving students can be in the club with a 3.5 or more for multiple semesters.

Upward Bound is a company that works with students to connect them with programs for over summer.

Upward Bound and AVID take field trips to visit college campuses.

Diana Arizu asked if students need to apply to Upward Bound and if there is any criteria for joining. Mr. Sweet let everyone know that they do have a recruiting process and that students need to have a minimum GPA.

### 7. Reports

- a. <u>DMS 2022 NWEA Testing Information</u> Mrs. Gassett presenting.
  - i. Report the degree of implementation of the Single Plan for Student Achievement. (SPSA) Record comments to be included in the SPSA for the previous year.

Mrs. Gassett went over what the NWEA test is, how often students take the test, and how that information is used.

Gasset showed both math and reading results for the fall of '22 overall for the school and then broken down by 7th and then 8th grade.

Gassett also showed how subgroups perform (English Language Learners, homeless, foster youth, special education) and how the school is intervening to help those students.

29.48% of students are meeting their best growth target in reading and 18.3% are meeting their best growth target in math.

There were no questions for Gassett regarding this information.

#### b. Ouarter Data Dive - Mr. Sweet Presenting

Counselors do a data dive at the end of each quarter to compare data to the previous year. Counselors looked at which days of the week saw the most discipline (Monday & Tuesday last year) . This year the highest day is wednesday.

Incidents by grade level have followed the 7th graders from being the highest grade level with incidents last year to now being the 8th graders having the highest number of incidents this year.

Mr. Sweet went over incidents by month and also grade data of both 8th and 7th graders. Mr. Sweet also went over counseling data from last year to this year and how the intervention specialists have helped with student interventions.

Diana Arvizu asked if students are being referred out to the intervention groups or if the students need to sign up. Mr. Sweet answered that they use a combination of data tracking and referrals from teachers for students to be involved in a group but students aren't able to sign up.

### c. ELAC input on Single Plan for Student Achievement

2 ELAC meetings but have not been able to have a quorum yet.

There has been focus on getting students reclassified in order for them to be most successful in high school. Parents were informed how to best help their children at home.

At ELAC's 3rd meeting they will be celebrating student reclassification.

Diana Arvizu asked if the meeting was in person or zoom and Mrs. Gassett answered that it is in person in the cafeteria.
