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LCAP Action Detailed Summary:

The Madera Unified School District California School Age Families Education (CalSAFE) Program provides comprehensive educational and supportive services targeted at pregnant and parenting teens and their families. Maintaining the CalSAFE program includes providing child care and development services for the children of parenting students, direct parent education to students, and linkages to community resources and support services for students and families.

Expansion of CALSAFE Program

Expanding the Madera Unified School District CalSAFE program includes building and operating a CalSAFE Child Development Center at Madera South High School campus to meet the needs of students attending school at Madera South High School and feeder schools and incorporating additional Parent Education Workshops to all CalSAFE students, which will address infant/toddler attachment and bonding, early literacy, mathematical vocabulary/concepts, brain development, and social/emotional development to enhance their parenting skills and awareness of child's development.

Budget Utilization

Budget will be utilized for personnel expenses, instructional materials, professional development for staff, transportation and entry fees for students, children and staff to attend a variety of field trips and the annual Teen Parent Conference, and start-up expenses for the new center at Madera South High School campus. Expenses associated with the Parent Education Workshops will be funded through a grant with First 5 Madera, as part of the Madera Unified School District State Preschool Parent Education Grant beginning in Fall 2016.

Transportation Support

Students who are a part of the program and require financial support with transportation will be given funds to pay for an annual bus pass for the 2016-17 school year. Additionally, the transportation department will try to determine if the newer buses, which includes better seating for toddlers, can be used in the routes where students who are a part of the program reside.
