**Student Health Wellness** - The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends children 2 years of age and older (who do not have difficulty breathing and who are able to remove the covering on their own) should wear a cloth face covering in public settings and when they are around people who don't live in their household. This is especially important when other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain. It is understandable that children may be afraid of wearing a cloth face covering at first. The American Academy of Pediatrics offers a few suggestions to help make them seem less scary to children.

Have the child look in the mirror with the face coverings on and talk about it together.
