School Climate & Culture :

What is bullying?

The word bully at times is loosely used, but what is bullying? According to stopbullying.gov, the definition of bullying is "unwanted, aggressive behavior among school-aged children that involves a real or perceived power imbalance. The behavior is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time."

If it is not bullying, then what is it?

Teasing - Everyone is having fun, no one is getting hurt and everyone is participating.

Conflict - No one is having fun, there is a possible solution to the disagreement and there is an equal balance of power.

Mean Moment - Someone is being hurt on purpose, reaction to a strong feeling or emotion, isolated event that does not happen regularly.

What can parents do?

Parents play a key role in preventing and responding to bullying. If you know or suspect that your child is involved in bullying, there are several resources that may help. It is important to learn to recognize the [warning signs](#) that your child is involved in bullying. Parents can learn [what bullying is](#) and [what it is not](#). Understanding what bullying is, is the first step in forming a plan to prevent or respond to bullying with your child. Many behaviors that look like bullying may be just as serious, but may require different response strategies.
