Benefits of Arts Education:

Student involvement in the arts is linked to higher academic performance, increased standardized test scores, greater involvement in community service and lower dropout rates. Arts education fosters critical thinking, problem-solving, collaboration and innovation. Students who attend schools where the arts are integrated into classroom curriculum outperform their peers in math and reading who do not have an arts-integrated curriculum. Art gives students a voice in learning and telling their stories. Art leads to civic engagement and lifelong arts participation. Art develops empathy, kindness, and cross-cultural understanding. Students consistently show deep critical thinking skills. Students have significantly better attendance rates. Students consistently test higher in reading and math. Students are more likely to pursue and succeed at post-secondary education. This is from the ART=Opportunity project out of CSU San Marcos.
