We are writing to share information about graffiti at James Madison Elementary School. Staff members discovered graffiti images in school grounds and in the boys and girls bathrooms. We are taking these incidents very seriously and are working actively with the Madera Police Department as part of the investigation. Due to the on-going incidents we will ban "Sharpies" at school. Please ensure that your child keeps "Sharpies" at home.

Parents, we ask that you speak with your children to ensure that they understand that if they participate in these types of vandalims on school grounds, they will be subject to disciplinary action. By working together we can keep James Madison School a safe and respectable learning environment.

Adult Supervision:

There is no adult supervision on campus prior to 7:25 am. For the safety of your child, please do not drop students off prior to 7:25. Thank you for your assistance with this safety matter.

Bus Loading Zone:

The front roundabout driveway is for our buses to be able to safely drop off and pick up your children every day between 7:25 am - 8:00 am & 2:40 pm- 3:15 pm. Please be sure you are using the back parking lot to drop off your child by car. We try to always put up cones as a reminder to parents both in the morning and afternoon however sometimes our staff is limited and unable to put these cones up. If you see buses in the lot, please do not enter. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated!



Back Gate Drop off:

Thank you for using the back parking lot to drop off and pick up your child by car. Please remember to drive up to the drop off zone prior to letting your child out of the car. This will help us avoid cars going around others because their child has already unboarded the vehicle, keeping staff and students safe throughout the process.

CLIMATE & CULTURE - PBIS Updates

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
February is Black History Month. This month-long observance in the US and Canada is a chance to celebrate Black achievement. Interestingly enough, the field of Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) was developed by a black college professor.

Dr. James Comer was the first African-American to become a full professor at the Yale School of Medicine. Since 1976, he has served as the Maurice Falk Professor of Child Psychiatry at the Yale Child Study Center and the Associate Dean at the Yale School of Medicine.

His pivotal research paved the way for the eventual emergence of social-emotional learning. SEL is the process through which people acquire and apply the knowledge, skills, and attitudes to develop healthy identities, manage emotions and achieve personal and collective goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain supportive relationships, and make responsible and caring decisions. In Madera Unified,

Kindergarten-Eighth Grade students receive weekly SEL instruction through

our board-adopted core curriculum: *Second Step.* Thank you Dr. Cromer for over 45 years of work to advance these important social-skills.
