Today starts Homecoming Week! We will have a lot of fun activities during the week capped off by parade, rally, and football game against Sanger on Friday, October 4th.





ATTENDANCE

Daily attendance is expected from all Coyotes and is not only essential to school success, but it's the law. Parents and students are responsible for regular attendance and on-time arrival to school every day that it is in session. A friendly reminder, the regular school day begins at 7:50am, at 8:40 on delayed start, and ends daily at 3:05pm. In addition, students have 6 minutes between each class to ensure prompt arrival to each period. To promote positive attendance behavior, MHS is working to inform parents of attendance expectations and consequences pertaining to poor attendance including SARB (School Attendance Review Board). Also, MHS has focused attention on alleviating unexcused tardies and absences on our campus by instituting weekly tardy sweeps, parent/student conferences, Thursday School, Saturday School, home visits, informational and SART/SARB letters, contracts, and referrals. Please be advised of the school wide expectations, practices, and consequences for violations.

Excusable Absences/Tardies:

Illness (Parent Note, allowed up to 10% of the days enrolled)

Medical, Dental, etc. (Doctor's note)

Funeral (in immediate family i.e. mom, dad, brother, sister, grandma, grandpa)

Unexcused Absences Period/Full Day = Possible Loss of Privileges and SART/SARB Process

Unexcused Tardies = Possible Loss of Privileges, Thursday School, and/or Lunch Detention



Nurse News

If your student uses an inhaler or other medication for after school activities, we still need a doctor's order on file in the health office.

In order to keep our students safe and healthy the district has certain guidelines that need to be followed. Students should stay home for fever over 100.0F or greater, vomiting or diarrhea in the past 24 hours. Students who are sent home with a fever of greater than 100.0F need to stay home from school the following day or until fever free for 24 hours without medications. They also need to be free of vomiting and diarrhea for 24 hours.

School Psychologists

Curriculum, Instruction, & Assessment

 Ask your students about their math and reading goals.
- Monday, October 7, 2019 teacher leaders will meet to continue our work on Madera High School's Strategic Academic Plan.
 There is no school this day.
- Any seniors who didn't complete their Mock Interview will have an opportunity to make it up on October 11, 2019.
- 1st quarter grades will be submitted by Tuesday, October 15. Progress reports will be sent in the mail shortly thereafter.
- October 16, 2019, sophomores will take the <u>National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test</u> (NMSQT) in preparation for the SAT their junior year. High scores on this test can qualify students for scholarships.
- The juniors will take the PSAT in preparation for the in-school SAT in March. There will be a special schedule for all students that day. All students must attend school. Absences without a valid reason like a doctor's appointment will be marked as *unexcused*.
