


NCAA Eligibility Center Who needs to register???

- I'm starting at a Junior college, do I register?.....YES! This will make your transition easier, and even possible after your first year of JC.




Create a new account

- Once your account is set up and paid you will receive an NCAA number




I have an account.... Now What?

- Submit your NCAA number to the registrar's office at school and request your transcripts to be sent to the eligibility center
- If you attended more than one school, each school must submit your transcript to the eligibility center
- Take the SAT test and have the college board submit your scores to the NCAA




2011-2012 Eligibility Center Student Athlete Resources

If you wish to participate in NCAA Division I or II athletics, you need to be certified by the NCAA Bilgibility Center. You need to qualify academically and you will also need to be cleared as an amateur student-athlete.

You are responsible for achieving and protecting your eligibility status!

For a Complete List of NCAA Courses

Visit www.eligibilitycenter.org and enter the site as an XCAA College-Bound Student-Athlete. Navigate to the "Resources" tab, click "U.S. Students" and then "List of NCAA Courses." Follow the prompts to search for your high school's list by name.

Division I (16 Core Courses)

- 2 years of natural/ physical science (1 year of lab if offered by high school).
- 2 years of social science.
- 4 years of additional courses (from any area above, foreign language or comparative religion/ philosophy).

- 3 years of additional English, mathematics or natural/physical science.

- 3 years of English.
 2 years of mathematics (Algebra I or higher).

- 2 years of social science.

Division II (*16 Core Courses)

- 4 years of additional courses (from any area above, foreign language or comparative religion/philosophy).



- Take the ACT or SAT and use the code "9999" to have your official scores sent directly to the NCAA Eligibility Center. Ask your high school counselor to send your transcript to the NCAA Eligibility Center at the end of your junior year.
- Check with your high school counselor to make sure you are on track to graduate on time with your class and have the required amount of core courses.
- Request final amateurism certification during your senior year (beginning April 1).
- Ask your high school counselor to submit your final transcript with proof of graduation.





"Students enrolling at an NCAA Division II college or university on or after August 1, 2013, will be required to complete 16 core courses. The current standard for Division II is 14 core courses.

Eligibility NCAA FRESHMAN-ELIGIBILITY STANDARDS QUICK REFERENCE SHEET

KNOW THE RULES:

Core Courses

- NCAA Division I requires 16 core courses as of August 1, 2008. This rule applies to any student first entering any Division I college or university on or after August 1, 2008. See the chart below for the breakdown of this 16 core-course requirement.
- NCAA Division II requires 14 core courses. See the breakdown of core-course requirements below. Please note, Division II will require 16 core courses beginning August 1, 2013.

- Division I has a sliding scale for test score and grade-point average. The sliding scale for those requirements is shown on page two of this sheet.
- Division II has a minimum SAT score requirement of 820 or an ACT sum score of 68.
- The SAT score used for NCAA purposes includes only the critical reading and math sections. The writing section of the SAT is not used.
- The ACT score used for NCAA purposes is a sum of the four sections on the ACT: English, mathematics,
- All SAT and ACT scores must be reported directly to the NCAA Eligibility Center by the testing agency. Test scores that appear on transcripts will not be used. When registering for the SAT or ACT, use the Eligibility Center code of 9999 to make sure the score is reported to the Eligibility Center.

Grade-Point Average

- Only core courses are used in the calculation of the grade-point average.
- Be sure to look at your high school's list of NCAA-approved core courses on the Eligibility Center's Web site to make certain that courses being taken have been approved as core courses. The Web site is www.eligibilitycenter.org.
- Division I grade-point-average requirements are listed on page two of this sheet.
- The Division II grade-point-average requirement is a minimum of 2.000.

DIVISION I 16 Core-Course Rule

16 Core Courses:

- 4 years of English.
- 3 years of mathematics (Algebra I or higher).
- 2 years of natural/physical science (1 year of lab if offered by high school).
- year of additional English, mathematics or natural/physical science.
- years of social science.
- 4 years of additional courses (from any area above, foreign language or nondoctrinal religion/philosophy).

DIVISION II 14 Core-Course Rule

14 Core Courses:

- 3 years of English.
 - years of mathematics (Algebra I or higher).
- years of natural/physical science (1 year of lab if offered by high school).
- years of additional English, mathematics or natural/physical science.
- years of social science.
- years of additional courses (from any area above, foreign language or nondoctrinal religion/philosophy).

PLEASE NOTE: Beginning August 1, 2013, students planning to attend an NCAA Division II institution will be required to complete 16 core courses.

OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- · Division II has no sliding scale. The minimum core grade-point average is 2.000. The minimum SAT score is 820 (verbal and math sections only) and the minimum ACT
- · 14 core courses are currently required for Division II. However, beginning 2013, students will be required to complete 16
- · 16 core courses are required for Division I.
- · The SAT combined score is based on the verbal and math sections only. The writing section will not be used.
- SAT and ACT scores must be reported directly to the Eligibility Center from the testing agency. Scores on transcripts will
- · Students enrolling at an NCAA Division I or Il institution for the first time need to also complete the amateurism questionnaire through the Eligibility Center Web site. Students need to request final amateurism

	Basic Education History. This includes a list of all high schools or secondary schools you have attended and the dates during which you attended them.
]	Additional Coursework. This includes details pertaining to any coursework you may have taken in addition to your normal high school or secondary school education (e.g., courses taken to improve a grade, summer school courses taken at a location other than your high school or secondary school, courses taken at a college or junior college, or any type of correspondence or internet courses).
)	Sports Participation History. This includes details for any teams with which you have practiced or played or certain events in which you may have participated, as well as information about any individuals that have advised you or marketed your skills in a particular sport.
	Payment. The Eligibility Center accepts Visa, MasterCard, Discover and American Express. If you are a U.S. resident, you can choose to pay by electronic check. Some individuals may qualify to apply for a fee waiver.
