#### **Mock Interview**

Mock Interview is a process by which students learn to prepare for the realities of looking for a job as an adult. Students are taught how to construct proper documentation for job searches, such as cover letters and resumes. Students also practice interviewing techniques for job opportunities with potential employers. At the end of the process, students dress in professional attire and present their portfolios to local business leaders for a trial interview. During the interview, these local business leaders give feedback about the quality of the document portfolio and the student's interviewing performance for future reference. Many of our students present themselves well enough to be offered jobs on the spot. This year 47 students passed the entire Mock Interview process on their first attempt. Great job Panthers!





## **Update on Substance Abuse and Additional Services**

When students commit a substance abuse offense, a multi prong approach has now been implemented to provide a means of correction for this behavior. In addition to students being suspended, they are also assigned mandatory substance abuse counseling in a timely manner. We have revised the counseling referral process to ensure all students are being served. We have also expanded our substance abuse counseling through the addition of on Intervention Specialist along two counselors through the Youth Empowerment Program and group counseling with Mr. Longoria. The goal is to provide prevention counseling for substances as well as further support for students who may be struggling with addiction. We want to be more proactive in our approach to substance use as opposed to reactive. It should also be noted that with each offense, an Expulsion Warning is being issued to communicate the seriousness of the offense and to discourage further incidences. We have also implemented a progression for discipline that includes suspension, in house suspension and intervention for each incident.

What can parents do? Parents play an important role to fight against prescription drug abuse.

Check your medicine cabinets, turn in old or no longer needed medication to your local pharmacy for safe disposal. Lock up remaining medication so that your child(ren) do not have access to them. Know the warning signs and speak to your child(ren) about the dangers of taking medication that is not prescribed to them.

# Reminder: Attendance Policy/Politica de Asistencia

California compulsory education law requires everyone between the ages of six and eighteen years of age to attend school. If you have three or more unexcused absences from school, you will be considered "truant". Your parents will be notified by mail with a truancy notice. If you have six or more unexcused days from school you may be declared a "habitual truant" and referred to the MUSD School Attendance and Review Board. Your School attendance is the first predictor of school success. Plan to be at school EVERY DAY. School attendance is reviewed daily. Students will not be successful in their academic achievement without regular attendance.
