

Mis-use of Prescription Drugs

Substance abuse amongst teenagers has been around for years. The misuse of Xanax, however, is on the rise. Often times teens have access to these pills by searching their parents or grandparent's medicine cabinets. Side effects of this medication include drowsiness, irritability, feelings of elation, forgetfulness, clumsiness, insomnia, weakness, headache and nausea.

Update on Substance Abuse and Additional Services

When students commit a substance abuse offense, a multi prong approach has now been implemented to provide a means of correction for this behavior. In addition to students being suspended, they are also assigned mandatory substance abuse counseling in a timely manner. We have revised the counseling referral process to ensure all students are being served. We have also expanded our substance abuse counseling through the addition of on Intervention Specialist along two counselors through the Youth Empowerment Program and group counseling with Mr. Longoria. The goal is to provide prevention counseling for substances as well as further support for students who may be struggling with addiction. We want to be more proactive in our approach to substance use as opposed to reactive. It should also be noted that with each offense, an Expulsion Warning is being issued to communicate the seriousness of the offense and to discourage further incidences. We have also implemented a progression for discipline that includes suspension, in house suspension and intervention for each incident.

What can parents do?

Parents play an important role to fight against prescription drug abuse. Check your medicine cabinets, turn in old or no longer needed medication to your local pharmacy for safe disposal. Lock up remaining medication so that your child(ren) do not have access to them. Know the warning signs and speak to your child(ren) about the dangers of taking medication that is not prescribed to them.

Health and Wellness

In accordance with the new CA Ed Code AB2246, Madera Unified will be promoting Suicide Prevention Awareness starting in October for grades 7th through 12th. Students at SITE will be participating in the Signs of Suicide Prevention program which consists of a short video with a class discussion and at the end students will complete a response card. Students who need extra support will have staff to meet with. A parent opt out form will be mailed home along with additional information.

Attendance Policy/Politica de Asistencia

California compulsory education law requires everyone between the ages of six and eighteen years of age to attend school. If you have three or more unexcused absences from school, you will be considered "truant". Your parents will be notified by mail with a truancy notice. If you have six or more unexcused days from school you may be declared a "habitual truant" and referred to the MUSD School Attendance and Review Board. Your School attendance is the first predictor of school success. Plan to be at school EVERY DAY. School attendance is reviewed daily. Students will not be successful in their academic achievement without regular attendance.
