ATTENDANCE / PARTICIPATION / GRADES / HEALTH

GRADES

Our 1st quarter report cards were mailed home the week after our quarter ended, and our teachers are also going over report card grades with our parents during their parent conferences. Some of our students really worked hard and earned some great grades for the 1st quarter. Way to go Wildcats! We also have some students who didn't put in as much effort in completing their daily assignments and making sure to submit them for credit. We're encouraging them to be more focused and responsible this quarter to make sure they stay on top of their assignments, to get them completed and makeup work turned in.

ATTENDANCE

Remember, attendance is taken DAILY, even on Wednesdays!! Students must attend their Zoom sessions on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday in order to be marked present for daily



attendance. On Wednesdays, students MUST turn in (submit) their assigned work, check in with their teacher, complete online expectations, etc. in order to be marked present for the day. If students don't turn in their work or check in with their teacher on Wednesdays, they are marked absent. Our primary classes are consistently showing great attendance each week, with weekly rates higher than 95%. Way to go primary students, for attending your class zooms each day!

PARTICIPATION

We ask that all students fully participate in their daily zoom lessons each day. We highly suggest students keep their cameras on to fully engage in their lessons, however it's not required. If students choose to keep their cameras off, they must participate verbally when called on to respond, and/or type responses in the chat box, through Pear Deck, etc. We need to know students are participating in the lessons each day, <u>and</u> most of all we enjoy interacting with them!

SOCIAL-EMOTIONAL LEARNING (SEL) & CHARACTER EDUCATION

Our students continue to receive **Second Step** instruction in social and emotional learning with units on skills for learning, empathy, emotion management, friendship skills, and problem solving. This month our K-5th grade class are focusing on "Empathy and Skills for Learning", and 6th - 8th grades are focusing on "Mindset and Goals". Take time to ask your child what they're learning in Second Step each week, and how they are using that in their daily lives.

ASSESSMENTS

READING INVENTORY (RI): Our 3rd - 8th grade students are taking the RI district assessment, which measures students' reading comprehension levels. This assessment is being used as part of our English-Learner reclassification criteria.

SPANISH PLACEMENT TEST: All 8th graders in our district are given the opportunity to take the Spanish Placement Test, which will help to appropriately place students in higher level courses and provide access to higher level Spanish courses sooner. It also creates more room in their schedule in high school to take other courses, can help them waive the CSU/UC language requirement, and possibly receive a seal of biliteracy upon graduation. What a great opportunity. This assessment is being given by our Spanish teacher on Wednesday, November 4 at 10:00 am, via Zoom.

PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

Our parent-teacher conferences are continuing for another week, November 2 - 6. We are thankful for these opportunities to meet with our parents and
