## Important Safety Updates

### Arrival and Dismissal Time:

Parents and caregivers who drive on campus and in neighborhoods near school can play an important role in enhancing safety near schools by following safe driving practices. It's important that parents comply with local school drop-off and pick-up procedures for the safety of all children accessing the school.

1. Our number # 1 priority on a daily basis is the safety of your child.
2. Please note: There is NO SUPERVISION ON CAMPUS for students who arrive BEFORE 7:25 am.
3. The front driveway of the school is designated as the BUS LOADING ZONE. If you are dropping off or picking up your child by CAR please be sure you do so in the BACK PARKING LOT located off of Santa Cruz Street. ( [School map](#) )
4. Parking in the drive thru area in front of the office is limited to Staff, School Buses, and vehicles displaying a handicapped parking permit. Your help in abiding by this safety measure is greatly appreciated!
5. Walkers after-school - Walkers are directed to meet the crosswalk duty personnel at the basketball courts after school. From there staff will take students to cross at the following 3 crosswalk locations:
  1. Stadium Road (to cross at Olive Ave.)
  2. Kindergarten Cross Walk (on Stadium Road near the Kinder playground)
  3. Santa Cruz Street (to cross towards Taco Express)
6. After-school - For your child's safety, please do not ask your child to cross the street while you are stuck in traffic, idling in your car. Kindly arrange with your child to meet you in the designated CAR drop off / pick area located at the back of the school.
7. Remember to obey the rules of a Red Zone area as identified by the department of motor vehicles - If a vehicle parks or idles in these red zones, it causes a serious traffic hazard where staff and students are put at risk as they try to safely cross the street. Vehicles in red zones obstruct the view of oncoming traffic.

## Safety and Health Protocol

Your child's safety and well-being is a priority at our school. Your support in following these safety / health protocols is much appreciated. As parents, you are all valuable partners in helping to slow the spread of illness that comes into the school system from the community.

- If your child is sick, please keep him / her at home. Familiarize yourselves with the [Symptoms of COVID](#) to help become vigilant at home in monitoring your child's health. The more we can work together on health and wellness, the safer our learning environment will be for all of our students.
- Parents / visitors are not allowed to enter the school campus at this time as another safety protocol. The only exception is for TK / Kinder parents who can ONLY enter campus to pick up their child during dismissal at approximately 2:40 pm
- Students who bring snacks / lunch to school are highly discouraged from sharing their food with other students to avoid the spread of germs ..

Suicide is the second leading cause of death among school age youth, however, suicide is preventable. Youth who are contemplating suicide frequently give warning signs of their distress. Parents, teachers, and friends are in a key position to pick up on these signs and get help. It is very important to never take these warning signs lightly or promise to keep them a secret.

#### Suicide Warning Signs

- ☐ Talking about wanting to die or kill oneself
- ☐ Looking for a way to kill oneself
- ☐ Talking about feeling hopeless or having no purpose
- ☐ Talking about feeling trapped or being in unbearable pain
- ☐ Talking about being a burden to others
- ☐ Increasing the use of alcohol or drugs
- ☐ Acting anxious, agitated, or reckless
- ☐ Sleeping too little or too much
- ☐ Withdrawing or feeling isolated
- ☐ Showing rage or talking about seeking revenge
- ☐ Displaying extreme mood swings
