### **Important Safety Updates**

#### Arrival and Dismissal Time:

ving safe driving practices. It's important that parents comply with local school drop-off and pick-up ocedures for the safety of all children accessing the school

- Our number # 1 priority on a daily basis is the safety of your child.
   Please note: There is NO SUPERVISION ON CAMPUS for students who arrive BEFORE 7:25 am.
- 3. The front driveway of the safety and the office is limited to Starr, School Buses, and vehicles displaying a handicapped parking permit. Your help in abiding by this safety measure is greatly appreciated!

  5. Walkers after-school Walkers are directed to meet the crosswalk duty personnel at the basketball courts after school. From there staff will take students to cross at the following 3 crosswalk locations:

- Stadium Road (to cross at Olive Ave.)
   Kindergarten Cross Wak (on Stadium Road near the Kinder playground)

- 2. Kindergarrent Cross wax (on stadium reducer busylocuting)
  3. Santa Cruz Street (for cross towards Tace Express)
  6. After-school For your child's safety, please do not ask your child to cross the street while you are stuck in traffic, idling in your car. Kindly arrange with your child to meet you in the designated CAR drop off / pick area located at the back of the school.
  7. Remember to obey the rules of a Red Zone area as identified by the department of motor vehicles If a vehicle parks or idles in these red zones, it causes a serious traffic hazard where staff and students are put at risk as they try to safely cross the street. Vehicles in red zones obstruct the view of oncoming traffic.

  ☐ Talking about wanting to die or kill oneself
- ☐ Looking for a way to kill oneself
- ☐ Talking about feeling hopeless or having no purpose
  ☐ Talking about feeling trapped or being in unbearable pain
- ☐ Talking about being a burden to others☐ Increasing the use of alcohol or drugs
- ☐ Acting anxious, agitated, or reckless
- Sleeping too little or too much ☐ Withdrawing or feeling isolated
- ☐ Showing rage or talking about seeking rever ☐ Displaying extreme mood swings I
