Below is a brief summary of a regular meeting of the <u>MUSD school board</u>. It is not comprehensive and is for informational purposes only. ## **Board Reorganization Items**

**STUDENT TRUSTEES** - Six MUSD high school students swore an oath Tuesday to support and defend the U.S. and California constitutions following their appointment as 2023-2024 advisory members of the Board of Trustees. The new members are:

- **★ Alternative Education**: Mia Garza
- ★ Madera High School: Suad Taha and alternate Zuleyma Rodriguez-Hernandez
- ★ Madera South High School: Daveli Leanos and alternate Adriana Gomez-Leon
- ★ Matilda Torres High School: Emmely Duque Martinez

Only two students will be officially seated as trustees on the dais at any regular Board meeting, and they will exit around 9:30 p.m. Student trustees can make motions, serve on subcommittees, and vote on agenda items, but those "preferential votes" won't affect whether items pass or fail. Each student will also lead a Student Voice forum with peers and will meet quarterly with the superintendent.

### **Information and Reports**

**UNION TIME** - David Holder, president of the Madera Unified Teachers Association, praised the enthusiasm, preparations, and activities at schools before and during the first weeks of class.

# Consent Agenda

- 1. **NETWORK STORAGE** The Board of Trustees unanimously approved an agreement with <u>AMS.Net</u> for the purchase of <u>"Pure Storage"</u> data storage and three years of support. The total cost will be \$289,349.45. The annual support cost after the first three years will be \$29,322.
- 2. **BMX ASSEMBLIES** The Board unanimously okayed an agreement with <u>Royale Management Group</u> to perform two <u>BMX assemblies</u> at Sierra Vista Elementary School between Oct. 1, 2023, and March 31, 2024. The 45-minute assemblies feature stunts by professional BMX bicyclists and a "5 Secrets to Success" message. The secrets include staying drug-free, "setting big goals," being motivated ("success requires hard work"), respecting others ("anti-bullying and kindness"), and staying in school. The cost will be \$3,394 from Sierra Vista School's <u>Title I funds</u>.
- 3. **OFFICE LEASE** The Board unanimously approved an agreement with the City of Madera to lease office space at <u>John Wells Youth Center</u>, 701 East 5th St., for a year. The space will be used for the <u>Expanded Learning Opportunities Program</u> and Athletics and Community Activities staff. The base rent will be \$1,725.94 per month (\$1.61 per square foot) from ELOP funds.
- 4. **FIELD TRIP** The Board unanimously okayed a Torres High School field trip involving 20 Varsity Girls Soccer athletes and 4 adults in late November and early December. The group will travel by vans to Newport Beach for the 5th annual Back Bay Invitational 2023. The costs will be \$2,000 for transportation and \$3,500 for lodging from THS Athletics and Athletic Boosters funds.
- 5. **EMPLOYEE TRIP** The Board unanimously approved a potential reimbursement request for a trip to Chicago, Illinois, involving at least 8 district employees in late October for the two-day <u>National PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports) Leadership Forum</u>. The total cost will be \$21,000.
- 6. **STAFF CHANGES** The Board unanimously okayed the filling of 4 cafeteria/playground aide jobs, 3 vacant paraprofessional aide positions, 2 vacant teaching positions, 8 other classified jobs, and 3 other certificated jobs.
- 7. **NEW LEADER** The Board unanimously sanctioned the hiring of <u>Daniel Aved</u> as the new vice principal of Martin Luther King Jr. School.
- 8. **RETIREES** The Board unanimously accepted the following retirements.
  - a. <u>Gail Jiles</u>, teacher at Berenda School, will retire on June 6, 2024, after 34 years of service.
  - b. <u>Kathryn Ghioldi</u>, Response-to-Intervention teacher on special assignment at Berenda School, will retire on June 6, 2024, after 33 years of service.





- c. <u>Juan Jaime Medina</u>, teacher at Madera South High School, will retire on June 6, 2024, after 30 years of service.
- d. **Mary H. Cortez**, Child Nutrition assistant II at Adams School, will retire on August 31, 2023, after 28 years of service.
- 9. **DISABILITY TESTING** The Board unanimously approved an agreement with San Francisco-based <a href="WestEd">WestEd</a> to support school psychologists, speech-language pathologists, and special and general education administrators. WestEd will assist them in developing district policies, procedures, and best practices for assessing English learners who are suspected of having a disability. The cost will be \$100,000 from a <a href="Learning Recovery Emergency Block">Learning Recovery Emergency Block</a> Grant.

### **New Business**

**HOME DEVELOPER FEES** - Staff presented a School Facilities Needs Analysis for home development to the Board of Trustees for their review and discussion. The analysis, which will be voted on in a later meeting, summarizes and calculates the fee the district can collect on residential development projects using a method set by state law. The district's current Level 2 developer fee for homes is \$5.04 per square foot. The maximum calculated fee is \$7.83 per square foot, according to the analysis. (Level 2 developer fees are meant by the state to cover half of the cost of providing new school facilities due to growing population.)
